Economic Justice at Work

Pay and benefits for working people

- 1 Support raising the minimum wage
- 2 Support fair scheduling for part-time workers
- 3 Support universal paid family and medical leave
- 4 Oppose diverting paid family and medical leave funds to pay employers, rather than employees
- 5 Oppose putting control of paid family and medical leave benefits in the hands of bosses, rather than the democratically elected government



Right to Housing

Access to safe, stable, dignified, affordable housing

- 1 Support closing the unsafe DC General shelter
- 2 Support guaranteed access to in-suite bathroom for shelter residents
- 3 Support extended access to shelters for families in need
- 4 Support access to housing for returning citizens
- 5 Support protection for elderly and disabled renters
- 6 Support preventing catastrophic rent hikes
- 7 Oppose restricting shelter access for people experiencing homelessness



Government for the People

Does our government serve regular people or wealthy donors?

- 1 Support a slow down of tax cuts for multi-millionaires and huge corporations
- 2 Support delaying the millionaires' tax cut
- 3 Support delaying the corporate tax cut
- 4 Support the NEAR Act, to prevent violence through a public health approach
- 5 Support Fair Elections, to encourage candidates for office to rely on small donations, instead of large corporate donations
- 6 Oppose a contract renewal for Veritas, which mismanaged United Medical Center
- 7 Oppose a contract for Corizon, which mismanages prison health systems
